Pastor's Corner

I've recently returned from a Week in St. Louis that I spent as an observer at the 223rd Presbyterian General Assembly, and WOW. A lot of folks around here heard about that and wondered if I was ever going to take a real vacation this year, and bemoaned being an OBSERVER in what, in their eyes, amounted to a week-long Presbytery meeting.

But siblings in Christ, just let me tell you, it was maybe the most fun I've had in years.

Presbyterians running around, discussing issues, making deals, deliberating over money, time, and talent. Prayers and worship interspersed with advocacy and business. At one point an Amber Alert went off and we stopped in the middle of very important business to pray for the lost child and make sure everyone looked at the alert.

We raised more than \$45,000 dollars to bail out people imprisoned under a hurtful cash bail system, and then marched to the courthouse without even a permit to show how powerful we really can be. We debated how best to use our monetary influence to influence positive environmental decisions in fossil fuels as opposed to pure profit ventures.

We denounced racist white nationalism, discovery language, and urged our government to rejoin the UN Council on human rights. We participated in bible study led by some of the finest biblical scholars of our time and applied that knowledge to our resolution against separating children from their parents at the border.

It was amazing. It was incredible. I'm getting revved up just writing about it.

I know it can be hard to remember here in Weyauwega, where we can think of ourselves as the third biggest congregation in a tiny town, but we are Presbyterians. We have a voice, a powerful voice, a loud voice. We are faithful, we are loving, and we are mighty.

God gave us this world. Let's make it BETTER.
